Public Privacy Notice

1 This Notice

This Notice is issued by Equatex AG, a Swiss company with its registered domicile at Vulkanstrasse 106, 8048 Zurich, Switzerland and its subsidiaries (hereinafter, the "**Equatex**", **Group**" or "**Equatex**", "we" or "us"). The Equatex Group is part of the Computershare Group.

This Notice is addressed to individuals outside our organization with whom we interact, such as visitors to our website www.equatex.com (our "**Site**") and visitors to Equatex' premises (together, "**you**"). Defined terms used in this Notice are explained in Section 13 below.

For the purposes of this Notice, Equatex is the Controller. Contact details are provided in Section 12 below.

This Notice may be amended or updated from time to time to reflect changes in our practices with respect to the Processing of Personal Data, or changes in applicable law. We encourage you to read this Notice carefully, and to regularly check this page to review any changes we might make in accordance with the terms of this Notice.

2 **Processing your Personal Data**

Collection of Personal Data: We may collect your Personal Data from the following sources:

- We may obtain your Personal Data when you provide it to us (e.g., where you contact us via email or telephone, or by any other means).
- We may collect Personal Data that you manifestly choose to make public, including via social media (e.g., we may collect information from your social media profile(s), to the extent that you choose to make your profile publicly visible).
- We may collect Personal Data when you visit our premises (e.g., CCTV images and visitor logs).
- We may collect or obtain Personal Data when you visit our Site or use any features or resources available on or through our Site. When you visit our Site, your device and browser will automatically disclose certain information (such as device type, operating system, browser type, browser settings, IP address, language settings, dates and times of connecting to a Site and other technical communications information), some of which may constitute Personal Data.

Creation of Personal Data: We may also create Personal Data about you, such as records of your interactions with us.

Relevant Personal Data: The categories of Personal Data about you that we may Process include:

- <u>Personal details</u>: such as given name(s); preferred name; gender; date of birth/age; nationality; etc.
- <u>Contact details:</u> telephone number; email address; and social media profile details.
- <u>Views and opinions:</u> any views and opinions that you choose to send to us, or publicly post about us on social media platforms.
- <u>IT information</u>: when you visit our Site, your device and browser will automatically disclose certain information (such as device type, operating system, browser type,



browser settings, IP address, language settings, dates and times of connecting to a Site and other technical communications information), some of which may constitute Personal Data.

Lawful basis for Processing Personal Data: In Processing your Personal Data in connection with the purposes set out in this Notice, we may rely on one or more of the following legal basis as required under applicable law:

- we have obtained your prior express consent to the Processing (this legal basis is only used in relation to Processing that is entirely voluntary – it is not used for Processing that is necessary or obligatory in any way);
- the Processing is necessary in connection with any contract that you may enter into with us;
- the Processing is required by applicable law;
- the Processing is necessary to protect the vital interests of any individual; or
- we have a legitimate interest in carrying out the Processing for the purpose of managing, operating or promoting our business, and that legitimate interest is not overridden by your interests, fundamental rights, or freedoms.

Processing your Sensitive Personal Data: We do not seek to collect or otherwise Process your Sensitive Personal Data, except where:

- the Processing is required or permitted by applicable law (e.g., to comply with our diversity reporting obligations);
- the Processing is necessary for the detection or prevention of crime (including the prevention of fraud);
- the Processing is necessary for the establishment, exercise or defense of legal rights; or
- we have, in accordance with applicable law, obtained your prior explicit consent prior to Processing your Sensitive Personal Data (as above, this legal basis is only used in relation to Processing that is entirely voluntary – it is not used for Processing that is necessary or obligatory in any way).

Purposes for which we may Process your Personal Data: The purposes for which we may Process Personal Data, subject to applicable law, include:

- <u>Our Site:</u> operating and managing our Site; providing content to you; displaying advertising and other information to you; and communicating and interacting with you via our Sites.
- <u>Our Premises:</u> managing the access to our premises with the aim of ensuring the security of all information and data located therein, as well as of any other physical assets;
- <u>Provision of services to you:</u> providing our Site and other services to you; providing you with promotional items at your request; and communicating with you in relation to those services.
- <u>Marketing communications:</u> communicating with you via any means (including via email, telephone, text message, social media, post or in person) news items and other information in which you may be interested, subject to ensuring that such communications are provided to you in compliance with applicable law.
- <u>Communications and IT operations:</u> management of our communications systems; operation of IT security; and IT security audits.
- <u>Health and safety:</u> health and safety assessments and record keeping; and compliance with related legal obligations.
- <u>Financial management:</u> sales; finance; corporate audit; and vendor management.
- <u>Surveys:</u> engaging with you for the purposes of obtaining your views.
- <u>Improving our services:</u> identifying issues with existing services; planning improvements to existing services; creating new services.



3 Disclosure of Personal Data to third parties

We may disclose your Personal Data to other entities within the Equatex Group and/or Computershare Group, for legitimate business purposes (including providing services to you and operating our Site), in accordance with applicable law. In addition, we may disclose your Personal Data to:

- legal and regulatory authorities, upon request, or for the purposes of reporting any actual or suspected breach of applicable law or regulation;
- accountants, auditors, lawyers and other outside professional advisors to the Equatex Group or Computershare Group, subject to binding contractual obligations of confidentiality;
- third party Processors (such as data hosting providers, etc.), located anywhere in the world, subject to the requirements noted below in this Section 3;
- any relevant party, law enforcement agency or court, to the extent necessary for the establishment, exercise or defense of legal rights;
- any relevant party for the purposes of prevention, investigation, detection or prosecution
 of criminal offences or the execution of criminal penalties, including the safeguarding
 against and the prevention of threats to public security;
- any relevant third party acquirer(s), in the event that we sell or transfer all or any relevant portion of our business or assets (including in the event of a reorganization, dissolution or liquidation); and
- our Site may use third party plugins or content (e.g., LinkedIn, YouTube and Facebook). If you choose to interact with any such plugins or content, your Personal Data may be shared with the third party provider of the relevant social media platform.

If we engage a third-party Processor to Process your Personal Data, the Processor will be subject to binding contractual obligations to: (i) only Process the Personal Data in accordance with our prior written instructions; and (ii) use measures to protect the confidentiality and security of the Personal Data.

4 International transfer of Personal Data

Because of the international nature of our business, we may need to transfer your Personal Data worldwide within the Equatex Group or Computershare Group, and to third parties as noted in Section 3 above, in connection with the purposes set out in this Notice and relying on the legal basis set out in Section 2 above. For this reason, we may transfer your Personal Data to other countries that may have different laws and data protection compliance requirements to those that apply in the country in which you are located.

Where we transfer Personal Data to other countries which have not been designated by the European Commission as providing an adequate level of protection for personal data, we provide for appropriate safeguards and we may do so on the basis of Standard Contractual Clauses. You may request a copy of our Standard Contractual Clauses or request further information about how we protect your personal data when disclosing it to a third country using the contact details provided in Section 12 below.

5 Data Security

We have implemented appropriate technical and organizational security measures designed to protect your Personal Data against accidental or unlawful destruction, loss, alteration, unauthorized disclosure, unauthorized access, and other unlawful or unauthorized forms of Processing, in accordance with applicable law.

You are responsible for the ensuring that any Personal Data that you send to us are sent securely.



6 Data Accuracy

We take every reasonable step to ensure that:

- your Personal Data that we Process are accurate and, where necessary, kept up to date; and
- any of your Personal Data that we Process that are inaccurate (having regard to the purposes for which they are Processed) are erased or rectified without delay.

From time to time we may ask you to confirm the accuracy of your Personal Data.

7 Data Minimization

We take every reasonable step to ensure that your Personal Data that we Process are limited to the Personal Data reasonably required in connection with the purposes set out in this Notice.

8 Data Retention

The criteria for determining the duration for which we will keep your Personal data are as follows: we will retain copies of your Personal Data in a form that permits identification only for as long as is necessary in connection with the purposes set out in this Notice, unless applicable law requires a longer retention period. In particular, we may retain your Personal Data for the duration of any period necessary to establish, exercise or defend any legal rights.

9 Your legal rights

Subject to applicable law, you may have a number of rights regarding the Processing of your Personal Data, including:

- the right to request access to, or copies of, your Personal Data that we Process or control, together with information regarding the nature, processing and disclosure of those Personal Data;
- the right to request rectification of any inaccuracies in your Personal Data that we Process or control;
- the right to request, on legitimate grounds:
 - o erasure of your Personal Data that we Process or control; or
 - restriction of Processing of your Personal Data that we Process or control;
- the right to object, on legitimate grounds, to the Processing of your Personal Data by us or on our behalf;
- the right to have your Personal Data that we Process or control transferred to another Controller, to the extent applicable;
- where we Process your Personal Data on the basis of your consent, the right to withdraw that consent; and
- the right to lodge complaints with a Data Protection Authority regarding the Processing of your Personal Data by us or on our behalf.

This does not affect your statutory rights.

10 Cookies

A cookie is a small file that is placed on your device when you visit a website (including our Site). It records information about your device, your browser and, in some cases, your preferences and browsing habits. We may Process your Personal Data through cookie technology, in accordance with our Cookie Notice, which is available on the Site.



11 Terms of Use

All use of our Site is subject to our Terms of Use, which are available on the Site.

13 Definitions

- **'Controller'** means the entity that decides how and why Personal Data is Processed. In many jurisdictions, the Controller has primary responsibility for complying with applicable data protection laws.
- **'Computershare Group'** means Computershare Limited, an Australian domiciled company and the ultimate parent of the Equatex Group, together with its affiliates and subsidiaries, including the Equatex Group entities.
- **'Data Protection Authority'** means an independent public authority that is legally tasked with overseeing compliance with applicable data protection laws.
- **'Personal Data'** means information that is about any individual, or from which any individual is identifiable. Examples of Personal Data that we may Process are provided in Section 2 above.
- **'Process'**, **'Processing'** or **'Processed'** means anything that is done with any Personal Data, whether or not by automated means, such as collection, recording, organization, structuring, storage, adaptation or alteration, retrieval, consultation, use, disclosure by transmission, dissemination or otherwise making available, alignment or combination, restriction, erasure or destruction.
- **'Processor'** means any person or entity that Processes Personal Data on behalf of the Controller (other than employees of the Controller).
- **'Sensitive Personal Data'** means Personal Data about race or ethnicity, political opinions, religious or philosophical beliefs, trade union membership, physical or mental health, sexual life, any actual or alleged criminal offences or penalties, national identification number, or any other information that may be deemed to be sensitive under applicable law.
- 'Standard Contractual Clauses' means the clauses issued by the European Commission, pursuant to Commission Decision (EU) 2021/914 of 4 June 2021 or such other equivalent decisions as the European Commission may issue from time to time, for the transfer of personal data to third countries in accordance with Article 46 (2) of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 ('General Data Protection Regulation' or 'GDPR').
